

So that our Zoom live class sessions can be focused, productive and respectful, all MS students are asked to follow these rules. We understand that you are learning from home and that it is a different environment than school. HOWEVER, in order for good learning to take place, during class time we want students to behave like they would in an in-person class

- Students should participate in Zoom calls sitting at a table or desk, ready for learning
 - Please have all materials for that class with you during the call - books, notebooks, pencil, calculator, etc.
- Students should NOT use photo filters or other backgrounds in their video connection of themselves. It is distracting to others and takes away focus
 - Please just show yourself, normally, and with the background of your room
 - If you are not comfortable with the background of the room in your house, please find a neutral, solid color “photo” background to put behind you digitally using the background feature in Zoom
 - Please make sure your display name is your actual name (first name or first/last), and not something silly
- Obviously, KSDS dress code is not required! (insert cheering here!!)
 - HOWEVER, we ask that students still make sure they are dressed appropriately for being in a class with a teacher. Please make sure your clothing keeps your body relatively covered up and is appropriate.
 - For tefillah and any Judaics classes, we ask boys to wear a kippah (and encourage girls to do so, too!)
- Once the teacher is ready to begin class (after welcoming everyone as students arrive in the meeting), students should keep themselves muted unless called on by the teacher
- Students should use the “raise hand” button feature under “Participants” button to indicate that they have a question or something to say.
 - The teacher will then unmute you and call on you to talk
- Please make sure your chat posts are related to the class. If you want to talk to a classmate for fun, please do it after class is over. The chat feature during a live class will either be:
 - Disabled entirely
 - Just student privately to teacher
 - Students can post to the chat that everyone in the meeting can see (no private chatting)
- Please respect the time/activity of your friends who may be in Zoom classes for their sections at times that your section happens not to be in a Zoom class. Please do not

send invitations to each other to meet unless you know that everyone involved does not already have a Zoom class going on at that time.

- Make the most of your Zoom live class time...
 - ... listen
 - ... take notes
 - ... contribute/participate
 - ... enjoy the opportunity to see your teacher and your classmates

- Please note that repeated violations of these Zoom behavioral norms may result in a student being asked to not participate in live Zoom classes
