Dear KSDS Families,

It is hard to believe that we are less than three weeks away from the first day of school. Krieger Schechter Day School's philosophy and priorities remain the same as always, even in this challenging and ever-changing environment. Thank you for your patience as we have been working to create a plan that allows for flexibility, supports our mission, and most importantly, is based on caution and care for the entire community.

Today, we are announcing, with approval from our Health & Safety Advisory Committee and the KSDS Board, that **we will be reopening school for the 2020-2021 academic year using a hybrid model of on-campus and at-home days for each grade-level, with a phased-in on-campus start for different grade levels.** Beginning on the first day of school (September 2nd), all students not scheduled to be on campus will have at-home, virtual learning every day until their grade is phased-in. It is important to recognize the tireless dedication of our faculty and administration. Their feedback and input were critical to the development of this plan, and their love for Krieger Schechter has been evident every step of the way. Our decisions have been made with the guidance of our Health & Safety Advisory Committee and through thoughtful discussions with all stakeholders, based on the values of our mission and our love for our students, school and community. We believe that the model presented offers us the lowest possible risk and the greatest opportunity for success and long-term sustainability.

While we are confident that our plan is thorough, we recognize that local and regional conditions are constantly evolving. Using metrics established by the Health & Safety Advisory Committee (slide 19), we are prepared to pivot as needed and will continue to reassess our model throughout the school year.
